A note from the Pastor

One of the themes of the Advent/Christmas seasons is the hope for peace. We long for peace not only in our world but also in our homes and hearts. We could probably safely state that the overwhelming majority of people on our planet desire that peace. However, it doesn't take too many unsavory characters to shatter that vision. Peace seems to be a fleeting possibility for our world.

We also strive for personal peace. We might think that if I only do this or that I'll know myself and find self-fulfillment. We instead find ourselves in a state of worry about how we are doing in comparison with others. This illusion can set us on the road to competition, envy and rivalry. We can become competitors who will fight for our place in the world even at the cost of others.

Henri Nouwen once wrote that "we are not who we know ourselves to be, but who we are known to be by God. We are not what we can acquire and conquer, but what we have received. We are not the friends we make, or the results we achieve; rather, we are who God made us in God's infinite love."

Mary experienced uncertainty when she said yes to the angel. She knew what oppression was when she didn't find a hospitable place to give birth to Jesus. She lived as a refugee in a strange land with a strange language. She knew what it meant to have a child who does not follow the regular ways of life. She knew who she was in God's infinite love.

The story of Jesus' birth reminds us that he came into a world that was not at peace and lived amid tension from his first days. To our eternal gratitude Mary accepted God's invitation even though it was inconvenient at best (Nouwen).

As we journey through this hopeful season may we remember that our personal peace comes as we recognize that all that is, is a divine gift born out of love and freely given to us so that we may share it with others.

While many are shopping, singing carols and getting together with family and friends at this time of year, there are those finding themselves feeling "blue" during the Christmas season.



Perhaps you are suffering from a broken relationship, employment insecurity, economic worries, health concerns, loneliness, or the loss of a loved one.

Each of us reacts to these stressful feelings in different ways. A Longest Night Service offering encouragement, healing and hope takes place Sunday, December 20, at First Presbyterian Church, 1432 Washtenaw, Ann Arbor in Monteith Hall (main floor, just inside the north door of the church, not the main sanctuary). There will be a service at 5:00 and one at 7:00.

Special Gifts Offering Dec. 2015 Safehouse Center

Safehouse Center provides support for those impacted by domestic violence or sexual assault. Their services are free and confidential for any person living or working in Washtenaw County. The services include emergency shelter for those in danger of being physically assaulted, counseling, legal advocacy, support groups, and especially HOPE. This is all possible because of community donors, business and volunteer partners, and grants. Over 5,000 survivors are served every year. The goal is to build a community free of domestic violence and sexual assault

Volunteers provide many thousands of hours every year staffing the 24 hour response teams, shelter, the hotline, the children's program, and the Teen Voice program. The help line, 4734-995-5444 is staffed 24 hours, 7 days per week. This is an important service organization in our community doing quiet but tremendous work serving our neighbors in their pain and fear

Search Update

he Search Team has been meeting on a weekly basis and is making good progress completing the lengthy forms required by the Synod and the Diocese. They have been referencing the information the Transition Team put together and researching for the rest.

They anticipate that things will slow down during the Christmas season and then Lent begins in early February; so they are hesitant to give out any kind of timeline. But rest assured that this will be done thoroughly, thoughtfully and we will find the right pastor for Holy Faith.



The Paper Pantry collects and distributes necessities that are not covered by Electronic Benefit Transfer (EBT) cards such as toilet paper, paper towel, detergent, hand soap, shampoo, tooth paste, deodorant, etc. We pass out between 40 to 100 pa-

per grocery bags that contain the needed items. Currently we are responding to the Seniors at Mill Pond Manor in Saline, the Independent Living Adults at Chidester Place Apartments in Ypsilanti and to low income families in the Milan area who come to the food pantry at Calvary Bible Church. The Paper Pantry is a partnership between Holy Faith, St Paul UCC and the Liberty Club, all from Saline.

Paper Pantry is funded with grants through the Episcopal Diocese, Lutheran Thrivent Financial and donations. All funds have gone to purchasing items. We also get donated items which are very much appreciated.

We need volunteers and donations. Delivery dates in January are 1/30 at Calvary Bible Church and for February 2/20 at Chidester Place, in Ypsilanti.

Volunteers bring in and pass out donated and purchased items. It is a lot of fun and takes about 1-1/2 hours on a Saturday morning.
