MESSAGE FROM THE PLT PRESIDENT

Ever since Pastor Ian announced that he had accepted a call to Trinity Episcopal Church, your parish leadership team has been working with representatives of both the Lutheran Synod and the Episcopal Diocese to find the right interim pastor for Holy Faith. We have overcome some of the concerns caused by our 2015 budget, which was finally adopted at the annual meeting this past week, and we are moving forward.

As this edition of the Psalter goes to press, we have some good news to report. Pastor Stan Eckermann, who has been with us for the past two months as our supply pastor, has agreed to serve as our interim pastor. During December and January, we have gotten to know Pastor Stan and have enjoyed our worship services with him. Fortunately for us, he is also a trained and experienced interim pastor who has led other congregations along their transition journeys.

As our three-quarter-time pastor he will lead worship services, attend to pastoral emergencies and participate in some of the day-to-day operations of the church—as well as guiding us in our search for a permanent pastor.

The transition period is not a time of stagnation, but rather an important time during which much strengthening, building of community and growth can occur. During this period, our congregation will have the opportunity to reflect on our heritage and engage in self-study to determine who we are now and in what ways we want to carry out Christ's mission in the future.

Within a few weeks, a transition team will be appointed to start the process of self-study. Because of the time that this activity will take, the transition team members should ideally not be members of the parish leadership team. This time of self-study is critical in achieving our desired outcome. Prayerfully consider if serving on this team is something that you could do for our church. We guarantee that it will be exciting and rewarding!

How long will this process take? There is no particular timetable or cookie-cutter solution. We must do a thoroughly open, prayerful, trusting assessment of ourselves to assure the outcome will reflect who we are and how we will serve the Lord. This could take six months, a year, or even longer, but please be assured we will find the right person to lead Holy Faith Church.

Annual Meeting

At the annual meeting on January 25, the 72 members present adopted a “challenge” budget with anticipated income for 2015 of \$131,110 and anticipated expenses of \$157,228 leaving a deficit of \$26,118.

In other action, Vicki English and Clarke Flewelling were elected to 3 year terms on the PLT and Susan Cummings was welcomed to fill out a 1 year term.

Representatives to the Synod Assembly are Andy Amstutz and David Dubay with Steve Jolliffe and Vicki English as alternates. Delegates to the Diocesan Convention are Tish Dersnah, Molly Hilton and Talle Jolliffe with Dan McGraw as alternate.

The newly formed PLT elected Steve Jolliffe as President, Vicki English as Vice President, and Ann Mayers as Secretary.




Book Swap

Feeding the Hungry at Delonis

Food Gatherers operates a Community Kitchen that provides 20 meals a week to those in need. This kitchen is located inside the Robert J. Delonis Center (which is also home to the Shelter Association of Washtenaw County) at 312 W. Huron Street in Ann Arbor. Holy Faith has the honor of helping prepare and serve an evening meal on the 5th Tuesday of the month (about 4 or 5 times a year). We can help prepare (3-5pm) or serve (5-7pm).

December 30, 2014 was a 5th Tuesday. Jeff and I, along with our son Keith, decided to have a family outing, so we all signed up for our first time to help prepare a meal. The prep shift begins at 3:00pm, so we arrived about 2:55pm. As we were walking to the Center, we met up with fellow Faither Georgine Steude, who also was on her way to help.

The kitchen is run by Scott and Paula; Scott was on duty when we arrived. We signed in, found our hats and aprons and were put to work immediately. We found Kent Handlesman, another fellow Faither, already hard at work making tea sandwiches with white bread, American cheese, slices of tomato and cucumber, and cream cheese; Jeff headed over to help him.

Keith was assigned (as he put it) "protein duty." He prepared full sheet trays by lining them with foil and parchment paper, laid out chicken legs (about 400 altogether), sprinkled them with taco seasoning and baked them. He then prepared more trays and unpackaged many beef and pork tenderloins which Jeff coated with Dijon mustard for later roasting (we heard it was for their New Year's Day dinner).

Georgine and I worked together (we were poetry in motion!). We cleaned and cut up about 2 dozen heads of cauliflower (it was steamed and seasoned with olive oil, salt and a garlic/pepper blend) and then we coated the baked chicken legs with barbeque sauce and layered them in huge serving pans. Just those two jobs took us about 2 full hours. When we finished and I looked up, Kent was washing dishes, Jeff was sweeping and Keith was part of a team in the back that was sorting good eggs from crushed eggs.

I also observed people cleaning and cutting up some lovely red strawberries and big pans of potatoes being mashed with butter, cream cheese and chives. There were trays full of beautiful slices of cakes and pies for dessert too. I'm sure there were many other preparations going on that I didn't know about and I'm not sure what the full menu

was. We prepared for the current meal and also prepped items for later meals. This is a commercial kitchen so all the rules and regulations needed to be followed—we cleaned, swept, sanitized, put things away and took out the garbage and recycling.

They serve about 125 meals at each sitting. We were wondering why so many chicken legs (about 400) were prepared and Scott, the kitchen director, laughed and said that, for their clients, there can never be enough bar-be-que or pizza.

When our two hour meal prep shift ended and we were getting ready to leave, the meal service team was arriving. We were happy to see more friends from Holy Faith—Katie Garvey, Steve Erickson and their two teenagers, Rita and Nels, along with their exchange student Hashim from Kuwait, coming in to take over. Katie said that Hashim enjoyed the experience and Rita and Nels love helping out at Delonis.

We left feeling good about what we did. The Community Kitchen is well organized and you know your time and efforts are well used and appreciated—AND we were hungry and ready for our own dinner after seeing and smelling all the good things that were being prepared for the shelter clients!

Things to Know:

- Wear comfortable, closed toe, non-skid shoes.
- Wear clothing you don't mind getting dirty (they provide aprons).
- Wear a short sleeved shirt or a shirt you can roll up/push up the sleeves.
- Cover your hair—they have a collection of old baseball hats, but you might like to bring your own. Otherwise they will give you a hairnet.
- Park in the lot that is southeast of the Center—you are given a voucher to cover some of the cost, but it didn't cover everything for us (we paid an additional \$1.40).

Food Gatherers holds up to 5 spots for us from Holy Faith on each shift—they cannot take more. They need to know how many are coming a week in advance. Therefore, you need to sign-up by 2 Sundays before the 5th Tuesday. Numbers will be called in the Tuesday before our date. Please be fully committed to your shift, but if something comes up and you can't go, please call Food Gatherers at Delonis directly. The short notice cancellation number is 734-678-9306.

M.I.S.S.I.O.N.

M.I.S.S.I.O.N. Inc. in Ann Arbor is a non-profit organization serving homeless people in this area. They originated during the time of Camp Take Notice. They have continued to provide many helpful services to those homeless who, for different reasons, are on the street. They work with the Delonis Center and have 2 Houses of Hospitality where a few people can stay. This winter they have arranged for day warming centers during the week at St. Mary's church and Lord of Light Lutheran Church from January through March. While the churches are donating the space and utilities, M.I.S.S.I.O.N. will be providing coffee and snacks, and a paid social worker as well as several volunteers for supervision. Donations they receive are used to provide services and basic necessities to this group of homeless people.

Sadly, the needs of our homeless brothers and sisters remain high. Happily, M.I.S.S.I.O.N. continues to seek creative ways to address the needs.
