THE PASTOR PONDERERS

Grounded in Prayer

Jesus famously said, "Where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them" (Matthew 18:20), which goes to the core of our practice as Christians. We are fundamentally a *communal* faith. The great commission to go and "make disciples of all nations" (Matthew 28:19) is not primarily about creating individual practitioners of solitary prayer, although it can certainly include that. It is about creating communities—liberated and connected spaces where two or three (or more) are gathered.

This truth impressed itself upon me again one Sunday a few weeks ago when I facilitated a conversation for those who had taken on the task of "praying for an enemy" over Lent. People shared their experiences in a deeply personal way—the wounds they had suffered at others' hands, their struggles to forgive or even to find words to pray for these enemies. Some had had long burdens of resentment lifted through this process of prayer. Others had felt called to become active and reach out to heal relationships. Still others had a much more difficult time with this challenging discipline. It was also striking how different people found different prayer methods that worked for them—reading a prayer from a prayer book, using prayer beads, praying through visualization and contemplation, etc.

But for all this variety, and all this difference in individual practice, what I felt most strongly was the movement of the Spirit in the sharing we did. I felt moved at the tears shed and the care shown. It reminded me that our church's primary task is building community, and I was blown away by the intimacy and power of the community we were building right there for a forty-five minute discussion on a Sunday morning.

I would like us to remember the importance of building community and grounding that community in prayer in everything we do at Holy Faith. And so I have a process to ask you, Faithers, to participate in whenever and wherever you meet. Take ten minutes or so to do the following:

- 1) Designate someone to offer the prayers that day.
- 2) Ask the group what we need to pray for. As people answer, have the designated pray-er take notes.
- 3) Then enter into prayer together, and let the pray-er offer the petitions or thanksgivings that have been requested on behalf of the group.

That's it! A simple way to open the door for us to know and lift up each other's struggles to God. Whether we are at an administrative meeting, or about to weed the food garden, or planning worship, or getting ready to deliver paper pantry bags, let's take a moment to be in prayer with one another, to gather together in his name to name his presence among us.

Celebrate the Bible!

Looking Ahead to Next Year: Some Sabbatical FAQ's

What is a sabbatical?

The word sabbatical gets its roots from Sabbath (to rest or to cease). Sabbatical for a priest is a time to renew spirit, reconnect with the spiritual, rest and grow. It is not a time for production, writing papers or sermons, but a time to renew. It is also not just a vacation; it is a time for nourishment, for deepening relationship with God and, for some priests, a time to renew with family.

How long will Ian be gone?

Ian plans to be gone May - August, 2015.

What will Ian be doing on sabbatical?

Ian's sabbatical has been named "Renewed in the Spirit" because he will be concentrating on the Holy Spirit's ability to bridge gaps between people of different cultures, languages, and beliefs. Ian plans to spend time in renewal by learning Spanish, attending a retreat and a homiletics conference and travelling to Peru with his family. (Actually he will be with his family for all but 2 weeks of the 4-month period.)

What will the parish be doing while Ian is away?

It is the PLT's hope that Holy Faith also will grow and be nourished during the sabbatical time. The parish will also focus on learning more about Latino culture and the problems of minorities living in the United States. We will have a series of lectures about the realities of Latino life in southeastern Michigan.

How will the sabbatical be paid for?

Ian has applied for a Lilly Grant which would cover everything for parish and pastor. If he doesn't get that grant, Holy Faith has money put aside to cover supply pastors and other congregational expenses, and Ian will pay for his plans out of his pocket.

Who will administer the church during the sabbatical?

Joan will run the office as usual, and we may ask for some volunteer help as well. We will also have a sab-

batical team to plan for this period. Since the sabbatical is mostly in the summer, the administrative burden shouldn't be too great.

Who will conduct the worship?

Don, along with visiting supply pastors, will conduct services during the sabbatical so that the parish will celebrate Sunday Eucharist in our normal fashion. Our supply clergy will preach some of the time, and there will also be an opportunity for Faithers to offer sermons or reflections.

Will Ian be in contact with Holy Faith during the sabbatical?

It is an important part of a sabbatical that a pastor be able to immerse himself in renewal without being pulled back into the running of the church. In fact, the Lilly grant stipulates no contact with the congregation. Should there be an overriding need to reach Ian, there will be a prearranged person who has the ability to contact him.

Who would I call if I have a need during the sabbatical?

The church office will still be open during the normal office hours which Joan will still be covering. During her vacation, we plan to staff the office with volunteers as needed. Prayer requests will still be handled as usual through the office, and Don will be available for pastoral issues.

How will we reacquaint with Ian upon his return?

The PLT will plan a celebration for Ian's return followed by some smaller group sessions in which both Ian and church members will share their experiences from the sabbatical.

How can I learn more about sabbaticals?

Please feel free to approach any member of the PLT or Ian if you would like more information. The PLT read *Clergy Renewal* by A. Richard Bullock and Richard J. Bruesehoff which has good information if anyone would like to borrow the book from anyone on the PLT.

Office Business

Holy Faith has entered into a new copier lease with Toshiba Business Solutions. Our new copier will be arriving sometime during the last week of May.

A huge thank you goes out to our copier committee: Steve Jolliffe, Neil Savage, John Czyrka and Rick Wales who wrote a Request For Proposal and solicited and reviewed bids.

We received a total of seven proposals and it was decided Toshiba was the best match for our needs and budget. Our hope is to save approximately \$163 per month compared to the old copier lease.

The Holy Faith Labyrinth is Under Way!

The Pray Team, with the approval of the PLT, committed to painting a Labyrinth in the parking lot this spring. We got the process underway on Saturday, May 16th and got the initial outline of a Traditional Baltic Labyrinth laid out and painted on the parking lot.

It was a project that we undertook with intention. We

gathered early on Saturday morning, talked about which pattern to use (considering the space and our desire to make it a handicap accessible labyrinth), and then we began the process with prayer and setting intentions for this labyrinth and what it will mean to the Holy Faith community and the Saline area community as well.

Roxane Chan was the leader of the process, as she has created more than one labyrinth. Her experience was invaluable. We started with the Baltic Labyrinth pattern, and then modified it a bit to suit our needs and the space available. The P.R.A.Y. Team was excited to create the space, to bless the place, to pray as we laid out the pattern, and to put our love and energy into this beautiful prayer path at Holy Faith. Watch for more finishing touches to happen in the coming weeks. The team has purchased a bell to use in marking the walkers entry and exit from the labyrinth and we will create an information card to laminate and leave at the entrance to the labyrinth so that anyone who is interested may come and walk and have some simple suggestions available to them. Once the labyrinth is officially finished we will begin to share some labyrinth information in the bulletins and newsletter, so that the Holy Faith family can know more about the labyrinth in our own "backyard". This information will also make it easier for us

to tell others about this wonderful tool for prayer and meditation.

Once we feel the labyrinth is finished, the Team will contact the National Labyrinth Registry and add the Holy Faith Labyrinth to the list of public labyrinths available for walking.

If you would like to walk the labyrinth, you are free to do so. The path is clearly outlined and should be easy to see. We are very excited that it is a labyrinth that has nice wide, flat paths making it easy for anyone with balance issues, or who uses a walker or wheel chair to participate in this form of prayer/meditation.

If you have any questions, feel free to ask anyone from the P.R.A.Y. Team: Suzanne Buchalski, Roxane Chan, Calesta Harrison, Paula Leonard, and Debbie Wollard. Special thanks to Gina Chan, who joined us for the morning and helped with the labyrinth. It was a wonderful morning of play, prayer and communing with nature. We even had a coyote visit while we were out there! Watch for the finishing touches to happen and the announcement that the labyrinth is officially finished.

Special Gifts Offering August 2014 Habitat for Humanity

Habitat for Humanity of Huron Valley is a very special and unique organization. Habitat partners with families to build a new life for themselves through decent, affordable homeownership.

In their first 20 years they built 100 homes. During the next 10 years they plan to double that number by expanding their work to renovating existing homes and providing Critical Repair and Weatherization work to an additional 200 low-income homeowners.

All Habitat homeowners purchase their homes with a non-profit mortgage. Like all homeowners they pay taxes to our local municipalities. Mortgage and escrow payments are not more than 30% of each family's gross income. Habitat manages the mortgage. Huron Valley Habitat also works closely with their partner families by offering classes that will prepare them to be successful homeowners.

As many of you know, volunteers provide much of the work, as do the members of the family.


Special Gifts Offering July 2014 Ele's Place

Ele's Place is a healing center for grieving children in the Ann Arbor, Saline and Lansing areas. Through peer support group programs, Ele's Place helps grieving children ages 3 to 18 who are facing the death or life threatening illness of a parent, sibling or other loved one. It is a non-profit community based program. There is no charge and all children are welcomed.

In appropriate age groups, children interact with peers who have suffered similar loss. Music, art, playacting, storytelling and writing provides the children with opportunities to express fear, anger, guilt, and sadness. Groups are led by trained volunteers and supervised by the professional clinical staff.

Ele's Place was established in 1991 and named in honor of Ele Stover who died at 11 months of age leaving behind four siblings. Ele's Place seeks donations to ensure that support groups are available at no charge to all grieving children in the area. They also seek volunteers and provide training. 

E-Giving Electronic Giving

Holy Faith participates with E-Giving as a convenience for those Faithers who like to transfer their pledge directly from their bank account to Holy Faith's bank account. You can transfer from your checking account or use a credit card.

Holy Faith must pay minimal fees for each transaction—so, as a courtesy to help the church offset these fees, consider adding 50¢ each time you give to Holy Faith from checking or, if you prefer using a credit card, add 25¢ + the appropriate processing fee (3% for Visa, Mastercard or Discover; 4% for American Express).

You can also help reduce fees by giving monthly or quarterly instead of weekly.


